Understanding MassAbility Services and Eligibility

MassAbility's Career Services division provides a wide range of supports to help individuals with disabilities obtain competitive, integrated careers

Eligibility for MassAbility's Career Services is made through MassAbility Connect.

Once eligible, a Job Seeker is assigned to a Career Counselor in the closest MassAbility Area Office

Upon assignment, the Career Counselor will begin working with the job seeker to develop an Individual Plan for Employment

Our shared vision:

To increase competitive integrated employment opportunities for people who are eligible for DDS services, acknowledging that competitive integrated employment includes supported employment, customized employment and supported self-employment.

Employment provides a pathway to independence, financial well-being, dignity and inclusion.

Shared view that people with disabilities, including those with intellectual and developmental disabilities, should have access to the services and supports necessary to assist them in obtaining and maintaining competitive integrated employment.

Self-determination and informed choice are principles we seek to have embedded in these services and supports.



Job Placement Services

- MassAbility's Job Placement Services focus on Competitive Integrated Employment Services
- Job Seekers can be receiving Day Services or other supports from DDS and work with a MassAbility Career Counselor
- MassAbility can provide initial Job Placement and Supports with long term supports being provided by DDS
- Many Job Placement providers work with DDS and MassAbility

Education and Training

- MassAbility provides supports to help Job Seekers with Training and Education needed for individuals to meet their employment goals
- MassAbility participants must meet Financial Need determination to access paid Training and Education
- MassAbility offers a wide range of Job Driven Training Opportunities and Hiring Events
- MassAbility supports students accessing college through the Massachusetts Inclusive Higher Education in Partnership with DDS. MassAbility typically supports students to access Credited Courses, with DDS covering non-credited coursework and support services.



Things to know about MassAbility Career Services

- MassAbility Career Services is not a long-term program
- Cases are typically closed 90 after successful job placement
- If a case is closed but the individual needs help on the job, the case can be reopened quickly
- Individuals can return to MassAbility after case closure by applying for a new case through MassAbility Connect
- Individuals need to meet financial need criteria for paid services, but anyone can receive counseling and guidance and job placement services regardless of financial need
- Education and Training needs to be towards the goal of employment
- All MassAbility Offices work in partnership with the DDS local offices
- Individuals can be served by MassAbility, DDS, DMH, DTA, etc at the same time, but services can not be duplicative



Other Programs Offered by MassAbility

Pre-Employment Transition Services

- MassAbility partners with High Schools across the state to connect with students with disabilities
- MassAbility contracts with community providers to provide Pre-ETS services to students ages 14-22
- Students can be in public schools, residential schools, home schooled or in college
- Pre-ETS help students learn about career opportunities, develop the skills needed to go to work, Self Advocacy and explore Post-Secondary training and education
- Services can be provided in schools, remotely, at community locations and in work settings during paid and unpaid internships
